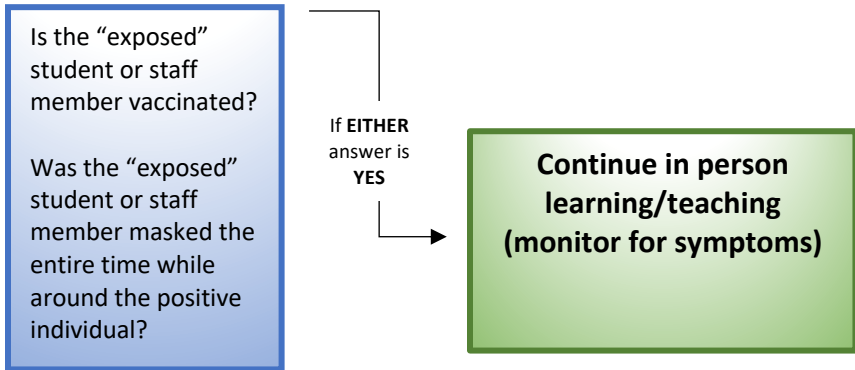


CONFIRMED CASES OF COVID-19

Q: When a student or staff member is out of school because of a positive COVID-19 test, symptoms or exposure, do their class, cohort, and close contacts need to be dismissed and quarantined?
A: If the student or staff member was in class within 48 hours prior to their positive test (or symptom onset), follow the flow chart below.

START ←



If EITHER answer is YES

Continue in person learning/teaching (monitor for symptoms)

If BOTH answers are NO

MAJOR SYMPTOMS	MINOR SYMPTOMS
Feeling feverish, having chills, or	Sore throat or headache
Temperature of 100.4°F or greater	Runny nose or congestion
Loss of taste or smell	Fatigue
New or unexplained persistent cough	Nausea, vomiting
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing	Diarrhea

1 major symptom = student or staff member remain at home.
2 minor symptoms = student or staff member remain at home.

QUARANTINE IMMEDIATELY

These individuals can return to in person teaching/learning **after 10 days (with no symptoms present)**. Return to work/school will resume on the 11th day.

Complete School COVID Case Report to Public Health – Send to Pinal County Health Department (CUSD HR Department)

Can the quarantine be shortened?

QUARANTINE SHORTENED TO 7 DAYS IF.....

A negative test is received (to be taken after 5 full days after the exposure).

These individuals can return to in person teaching/learning **after 7 days (with no symptoms present)**. Return to work/school will resume on the 8th day.
